#### BRO HOF SLOTT GC

**BRO HOF SLOTT GOLF CLUB** is a legend in the Swedish golf community. Before the first blade of grass sprouted on the first fairway, stories passed about how the owner, Björn Orde, spent tens of millions of dollars on the design and construction of the place. Robert Trent Jones Jr., the famous architect, who was invited to inspect the course during construction, designed the course. The fact that the course was given the prestigious Scandinavian Masters Tournament for 2009 before it had opened for its inaugural round of golf speaks to its quality. It is the best course in Sweden and maybe one of the best courses in all of Europe.

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VISBY IS THE LARGEST CITY ON THE LARGEST ISLAND of the east coast of Sweden. The island of Gotland is almost entirely by land or plane, and this isolation gives the island a sense of the native spirit not found anywhere else. Gotland is an ancient land, whose beginning dates back to pre history. Native of Gotland speak a dialect of Swedish stemming from their own native language called Gotnish. Gotland's rich past is full of tales of traders and seafarers, knights and pirates, kings and queens. The city of Visby is a well-preserved medieval town dating back to 1150 AD and most are still in use. The ancient walls still stand and surround the old part of the city.

Just a short walk from the city walls, we stayed at the Strand Hotel. The hotel was originally built in 1880 on the island. Visby gives the modern visitor a taste of what living in the middle Ages must have been like. Gotland has many activities over the summer, including festivals and recreation of ancient local games. The island population of about 60,000 may triple during some times of the year due to the influx of visitors. Visby is a great place to visit at any time of the year, but especially weekend or in September, but anyone is the right time to visit who has become one of our favorite courses in Sweden.

The Västby Golf Club, also known as Sandhamn, is about 23 kilometers from the city. The club is located on the highway adjacent to the sea. Västby would be in any book about Swedish golf. It may have the most visually stunning opening three holes of any golf course in Sweden. As you leave the grove of trees surrounding the first tee, you are presented with a spectacular view of the Baltic Sea, with waves lapping at the base of the tee. You then turn 90 degrees and look straight at the sea and then the steadily narrowing that with the cliff from the lake descending the fairway and running all the way up the right side. You then enter the coastal woods, playing tree-lined fairways until the spectacular finish starting with number 12. This hole is a par five, which is a bit unusual for a coastal course, but a much deserved long boat of the legends. Number 11, an imposing par five, is where your tee shot must go over a lake before it heads up hill, back to the sea. You then follow holes number 14, 15, 16 and 17 along the coast. The lighthouse will be
